In addition to Goodwill, there are many nonprofits in the greater Indianapolis area that are actively seeking donations of pre-owned clothing, housewares, and other items. This list is ever evolving, but it's a start!

Please note that items should be in good working order. Check organizational websites to confirm donation guidelines.

HOUSEWARES

Exodus Refugee Immigration – https://www.exodusrefugee.org/

Helps refugees from more than 50 different countries establish new lives in Indiana

• New or gently used furniture, linens, kitchen items and more

BICYCLES

Provides accessible bicycles and teaches youth life and leadership skills that improve their physical and mental well-being

• Glass, ceramic, plastic, etc. vases or containers that hold fresh-cut flowers and water; ideal vases are 5"-9" tall with a 3.5" opening

ELECTRONICS

RecycleForce – https://recycleforce.org

Committed to reducing crime through employment and job training, while improving the environment through responsible electronics recycling

• Any working or broken electronics (basically anything with a cord) and scrap metal can be dropped off for recycling; all devices containing memory or data will be destroyed; see the complete list of recyclable materials
